All of our lives, we have been taught that the church is not the building, it is not the steeple, it is all the people. That is, of course, true. But for us to best do the work of our ministry - to proclaim God's love, to worship together, to provide Christian Education for our children, to better serve our community, to make a difference in our own small corner of God's universe - we need to have an adequate facility.

Ultimately, your commitment decision is between you and your Lord. Please share in the God-given task. Give more than your treasure. Give your trust and step 'Forward in Faith' for the glory of God.
