
Naslund's most recent book is Four




Spirits (William Morrow, \$26.95), a fictional account of the Civil Rights struggle, including the horrific church bombing that took the lives of four young girls in Birmingham.

Jenkins's latest work is an eight-tape audio book he produced; it is based on his 2001 text Looking for Alaska (St. Martin's Griffin, \$14.95; audio book, www.peterjenkins.com, \$39.95). The book and taped reading trace the 1½year sojourn by Jenkins and his family in sled dog-and-blizzard territory. Terry Kay's newest novel is The Valley of Light (Atria Books, \$24).
