Opulent Opryland

Our stay at the sprawling Gaylord Opryland Resort & Conference Center proves entertaining all on its own. Blessed with directional prowess, my son navigates his less talented family members through the 9-acre Nashville landmark. Joshua and Brennan are amazed at the resort's interior jungle of greenery, fountains, and waterfalls. They gape in awe at the indoor river.

Scampering on to the Delta Flatboats, we wind our way through the 4½-acre indoor atrium. The children compete to see who can spot more of the 200 fish swimming these waters.

Refreshed, we head for the resort's convention center to see a traveling art exhibit. If there's time, we plan on visiting some of the city's outstanding art facilities, such as the Frist Center for the Visual Arts and the Tennessee State Museum.

Dining Delights

What's a vacation without a bit of overindulgence? Great food at Gaylord
Opryland—from the casual Rachel's
to the reservations-required Old Hickory Steakhouse—fuels us throughout
our stay. At Opry Mills, The Aquarium
Restaurant with its aquatic display and
tasty menu provides a great family
dining spot. The sweet potato pancakes at the kid-friendly Pancake
Pantry (near Vanderbilt University) offer a delicious option as well.

Finally, we round out our trip with a bit of history, taking the short drive down I-40 east to The Hermitage. President Andrew Jackson's home brings the kids' school lessons to life, providing the perfect ending note for our family vacation.
